



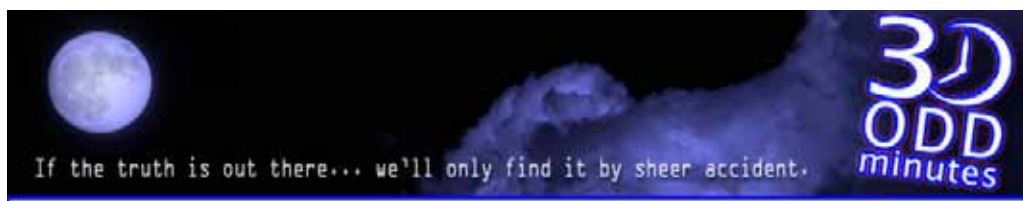

Classic Episodes to Run Throughout the Day Oct. 31

Produced and developed at ABMI, Jeff Belanger's *30 Odd Minutes* is now enjoyed by an audience of up to three million cable and online viewers across the country. This Halloween, Monday, Oct. 31, ABMI will cablecast classic episodes throughout the day, beginning at 6 a.m. and continuing right through the witching hour of midnight.

Belanger has authored more than a dozen books on the paranormal. He founded Ghostvillage.com, the most popular "ghostly destination" on the web. Belanger frequently appears on The Travel Channel, History Channel, and other national shows. He lives in Bellingham.



Gomes of Mendon Voted Full Member; Fischer Creates Facebook Page for ABMI

The Board of Directors unanimously approved for ABMI membership Gregory Gomes of Mendon in a vote taken at the Oct. 11 monthly meeting.

Gomes plans to produce a show about soccer called *The Offside Trap*. Gomes said ex-Patriots kicker John Smith is a prospective guest for the show.

In other business, Board Vice-President Jereme Cooper asked Production Coordinator Erik Fischer whether the new ABMI Facebook page was ready yet. Fischer said yes, the page is up and running. Fischer just needs to get the embedded logo to put on the website.

Station Manager Patrick Fleming said the wireless transmission unit has not been fully tested. "I'll put it in the van in the parking lot and see if it works." Nick Russell of Lightway will help Fleming test it. Fleming said, "All the areas we would send from are covered by Verizon 4G service, except for Miscoe, which is 3G."

Cooper asked about the visit to the Techno Expo in New Hampshire. Fleming said it went well. Access A-V sponsored it. They are the company from which ABMI bought the new studio setup. Fleming and Fischer toured all the display tables. They concentrated on the new cameras, as well as the Sony suitcase



studio called Sony Anycast. Fleming said the Anycast looks good but he would like a system dedicated just to the production van.

In new business, Fleming said *Dungeon of Dr. Dreck* producer Michael Legge requested \$50 from his budget to pay for PegMedia downloads. The Board passed a motion by Cooper and seconded by Treasurer Bob Carlson granting the request. Fleming said he will talk to Legge to see exactly what he is asking for in the future regarding PegMedia.

Fleming said ABMI Member Rick Teter wants to buy the old soundboard from the studio. The Board gave Fleming the go-ahead to offer it to Teter for \$100.

Cooper asked about the van. Fleming said Access A-V could equip an empty van and customize it for us. Cooper asked about wireless cameras. Fleming said the battery power to send the signal would not last long enough for a whole concert. ABMI President John Lee asked whether we might do one wireless camera as a beta test. Fleming agreed that might be the way to go.

Lee noted in his President's Remarks, "Everything is looking to be on the upswing." He hailed the Facebook page as a good addition to the station's web presence. In summary Lee said, "Keep everything going the way it is, and stay the course."
