### Wireless Cameras Work Well at Concert; Streambox Unit Tested and Purchased

At the ABMI monthly board meeting July 15 Production Coordinator Erik Fischer told Board Vice-President Jereme Cooper that the new wireless camera setup worked well at the recent concert. Fischer reported that the roving cameraman could move around the gazebo on the Bellingham Common without any picture dropout. Cooper said a wireless camera might come in handy for a shot from centerfield when covering baseball.

Station Manager Patrick Fleming told the board that he successfully tested out the Streambox unit which allows transmission of a live signal back to the station. The unit has been purchased and will be installed when it is delivered. Fleming paid Nick Russell of LightWay for the unit.

In other business, Fleming told the board that the website has been redesigned by LightWay.

Cooper asked if Strictly Business producer Lynn Scornavacca used to work for PBS. Fischer said yes, and that Scornavacca also worked for Ch. 5 in Boston.

Cooper asked if ABMI volunteer Dylan DiAntonio was still interested in the open board seat. Fischer said he thinks DiAntonio has a lot on his plate right now and has not made a decision on the board seat.

Fleming explained to Board Member Diane Mela Souvanna how the treasurer's reports are organized and why the dates go back a few months.

Board Secretary Earl Pearlman asked about the Verizon check.





Fleming said the check will be in next month. Fleming noted that the total number of subscribers may be on the rise as new housing is going up in Mendon and Bellingham.

Souvanna said it was nice that Publicity Director Steve Saraceno saw Paul DeMaria at the recent concert. Saraceno told the board that DeMaria used to work at the station when it first opened and that he wants to tour the studio soon. Paul may bring along his father, Ron, who also worked at the station in the early days.

Cooper asked how things were going with the concert preparations for the Mendon Town Beach. Saraceno said Dan Byer is the new rec director for Mendon and was very helpful as usual.

Cooper asked about the Veterans Oral History Project. Fischer said producer Marjorie Turner Hollman is steadily getting the vets in to talk. Fleming added that the show is produced in accordance with the guidelines set down by the Library of Congress.

Cooper suggested that the station try to keep up on coverage of the high school teams, especially with all the recent state championship teams in Bellingham.

In old business, Fleming said there will be three new hi-def cameras in operation this year at the concert shoots. Two will be stationary on tripods and one will be portable.

Fleming said it would cost around \$2,000 to repair the air conditioning unit. Fleming said a new unit would cost around \$20.000. The board voted unanimously to accept the bid from Victory to repair the air-conditioning unit.
