# **ABMI Upgrades Control Room**



Technicians from Access A.V. in New Hampshire came down to the studio for several days in February and March to help upgrade the Broadcast Pix control room system. Workers installed a new MICA 100 HD 8-input switcher (see photo, p. 3), several Marshall Dual 7-inch rackmount monitors, and two Dell 27-inch 1080p LED monitors (pictured below). Also installed was a Blackmagic broadcast quality record/playback deck (see p. 3). It is the first major control room upgrade since ABMI went digital over a decade ago.



# Fleming Tells Board of 'Wish List' For New Equipment and Upgrades

Station Manager Patrick Fleming told the ABMI Board of Directors at their meeting March 8 that he has a 'Wish List' detailing new equipment and improvements intended for the studio. The list will be presented during the upcoming contract negotiations with Verizon and Comcast.

Board President Nick Russell asked whether the meetings for the new contract with Verizon are being recorded. Fleming said the meetings are not recorded, but minutes may be taken.

In other business, Russell asked Production Coordinator Jeff Paul about *In The Spotlight* producer Don Keller. Paul said Keller in still producing shows from time to time.

Russell asked about the new iTunes purchases for the video bulletin board. Fleming explained that it was about time to get some new tunes in the rotation.

Board Secretary Diane Mela Souvanna asked whether Michael Legge is still





producing *The Dungeon of Dr. Dreck*. Paul said yes.

Russell commended Publicity Director Steve Saraceno for the \$3,000 sponsorship Saraceno recently secured from Middlesex Savings Bank. The sponsorship will fund two shows in the Concerts on the Grass series this summer -- one concert in Bellingham and one in Mendon.

Saraceno told Board Member Sue Carlson that he had spoken to *Mendon Town Crier* editor Jane Bigda with regard to publishing station updates in the paper. Saraceno said Bigda is open to the idea -- but she will only publish the updates if there is room in the paper. Saraceno said he also spoke with *Bellingham Bulletin* editor Pam Johnson, who stated similar terms.

Saraceno told Carlson that he had spoken with *Real Estate and Beyond* producer Mike Shain about advertising in the *Mendon Town Crier*. Shain's budget replenishes in April at which point Shain will decide.

Carlson suggested contacting Taft Library to see if they might want to shoot a program at the studio. Saraceno said he would contact Andrew Jenrich.

Applicants must show a demonstrated interest in Mass Communications but need not plan to major in the subject.


Applications will be available at area schools as well as the ABMI studio at 10 Williams Way. They will also be posted on the Bellingham High School website.
