Fleming Informs ABMI-TV Board That Town Hall Upgrade is Paid For

ABMI-TV Station Manager Patrick Fleming told the Board of Directors during the Jan. 5 meeting on Zoom that the upgrade of the video system at Bellingham's Municipal Building has now been paid for.

In other business, Fleming asked the Board whether he could give the used equipment to ABMI Producer Brian Sutherland for use on his church show. The Board agreed to this. Board Secretary Earl Pearlman asked whether Hawk TV might use any of the gear. Fleming said it would be a step down from what Hawk TV currently has.

Fleming said the only notable item in the Oct. 2022 Treasurer's Report was the one-time annual payment to Nick Russell's company for streaming services.

Fleming informed the Board that BHS stu-





dents had visited the studio for video instruction from Production Coordinator Tyler McMinniman. Fleming expects a different rotation of students next week and in the weeks to come.

McMinniman was out sick but the Board reviewed his report for Nov.-Dec. 2022. Board Member Sue Carlson lauded McMinniman's effort on the Christmas special for the Mendon Minstrels -- Carlson said the group received many compliments on the production.

Fleming showed the Board a list of McMinniman's recent productions and said he has been very busy shooting and editing.

Fleming said Verizon recently owed \$18,000 in capital funding. They have now paid off \$14,000 of that balance and said they will pay off the balance early in 2023.

Fleming said the new equipment for the Arcand Meeting Room has been received and is ready for installation.
